
Acid Rain

Acid rain encompasses both wet (rain, snow, fog) and dry (particulate) acidic depositions that occur near and downwind of areas where major emissions of sulfur dioxide (SO₂) and nitrogen oxides (NOx) result from burning fossil fuels.

Acid rain is defined as precipitation in which P^H below 5.6

FIGURE 22.11 The pH scale. (Source: Modified after U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, 1980.)






FIGURE 22.13 Idealized diagram showing selected aspects of acid rain formation and paths.
